Job Summary

The Young Leader's Programme Group Leader will play a key role in the delivery of Norden Farm's annual Summer Leadership Programme.

They will actively support and mentor participants through their leadership week, hosting guidance and training sessions and supporting the delivery of participant led community workshops.

The Group Leader will work with the Education Manager to capture data, document the programme and ensure necessary evaluation information is received.

The Group Leader will ensure that participants stay on task and take a proactive approach to their placement.

Role Context

In addition to the varied programme of theatre, music, film and more, each year Norden Farm's Education and Outreach Programme engaged with over 15,000 people.

Within each project we work with many schools and community groups and members of the local community to present high quality arts events which bring people together, offer new and exciting experiences and serve local people.

One of the projects we run is our annual Young Leadership Programme.

The Young Leadership Programme supports young adults to gain hands-on work experience within a professional arts venue, it also supports future Arts Award, Duke of Edinburgh Award, college and university applications.

During the summer holiday Norden Farm is joined by up to 4 Young Leaders a week – they work to a timetabled schedule across their week, assisting with craft, storytelling, holiday clubs and various front of house activity.

One of the main tasks which the group undertake in their week is the planning and production of their own workshop, which is open to the public, at the end of the week. (previous participants have held sand castle competitions, treasure hunts, storytelling sessions and ukulele workshops).

This project runs alongside Norden Farm's popular Beach Project.

Key Responsibilities

- 1. Oversee the delivery of the Young Leadership Programme
- 2. Host training and mentoring sessions with participants at scheduled intervals throughout their leadership week (content provided)
- 3. Mentor participants through their placement, promoting a proactive approach to the timetabled activities
- 4. Creatively support participants to document their placement with photography, film, blogging and/or vlogging
- 5. Support participants delivery of end of week community workshops, including the purchasing of materials etc (budget provided)
- 6. Collect and compile participant entry and exit surveys in line with Norden Farm's project evaluation framework
